

Quiz #8: Fluids

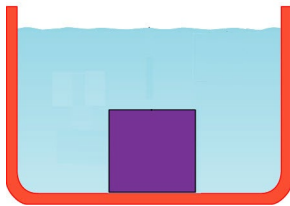
Problem 1 (2 points)

A solid lead sphere and a solid aluminum sphere of the same diameter are both completely submerged in water. Lead is denser than aluminum. Is the buoyant force on the lead sphere greater than, less than, or the same as the buoyant force on the aluminum sphere.

- a) buoyant force on lead sphere $>$ buoyant force on aluminum sphere
- b) buoyant force on lead sphere $<$ buoyant force on aluminum sphere
- c) buoyant force on lead sphere $=$ buoyant force on aluminum sphere
- d) more information is needed

Problem 2 (4 points)

A lead cube with a mass of 12.5 kg and a density of $11,340 \text{ kg/m}^3$ is at rest at the bottom of a pool of water as shown in the figure below. What is the normal force acting on the cube?



Problem 3 (4 points)

A submarine is operating at 35.0 m below the surface of the ocean. The density of seawater is 1025 kg/m^3 . How much force does the water exert on a circular window of radius 0.45 m?
